CLOSING ORDER


THE COMPLAINT: Complaint alleges that the Subject violated Section 491.009(2)(d), Florida Statutes, by making false, deceptive or misleading advertisements in a profession.


THE FACTS: The investigation substantiated the claim. Conference marketing materials were found to be false when they offered continuing education credit when in fact providership had lapsed. The Subject stated a mistake had been made by letting the providership expire.

THE LAW: Based on the foregoing, probable cause does exist to believe that the Subject violated Chapter 491, Florida Statutes. However, this case will be closed with a Letter of Guidance issued to the Subject.

It is therefore, ORDERED that the complaint be and the same is hereby CLOSED.
