NONDISCIPLINARY CONSENT AGREEMENT, DECISION AND ORDER

IT IS HEREBY AGREED by the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Division of Corporations, Business & Professional Licensing (Division), and Charles Frank Burgess, M.D., M.S.W. (Dr. Burgess) as follows:

1. Licensure. Dr. Burgess holds Alaska physician license number 3113, that was first issued to him on August 13, 1993, and will expire on December 31, 2010 unless renewed.
2. Admission/Jurisdiction. Dr. Burgess admits and agrees that the Alaska State Medical Board (Board) has jurisdiction over the subject matter of his physician license in Alaska and over this agreement.
3. Facts. Dr. Burgess admits the following:
 - a. To renew his physician license for the licensing period beginning January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2012 (2011-2012), Alaska Statute (AS) 08.64.312 requires Dr. Burgess to have completed certain continuing medical education requirements (CME) during the concluding license period (January 1, 2009 - December 31, 2010). These requirements are set out in 12 AAC 40.200 - 12 AAC 40.240 and include the completion of 50 credit hours obtained in a Category I CME program accredited by the American Medical Association or obtained in a Category I or II CME program accredited by the American Osteopathic Association (AOA).
 - b. A physician who fails to meet the CME requirements during a concluding licensing period may request an extension of time to meet those requirements under the provisions of 12 AAC 40.200(b).
 - c. Dr. Burgess applied to renew his physician's license for the January 1, 2011 - December 31, 2012 licensing period by completing a 2011-2012 Medical License (MD/DO/DPM) Renewal Application (renewal application), received by the Division on December 6, 2010. As part of his renewal application, Dr. Burgess disclosed that he had not completed the required CME during the concluding licensing period, and he attached a letter of explanation.
 - d. Dr. Burgess admits that he completed only 31.5 of the 50 CME hours required under 12 AAC 40.200 during the concluding licensing period.

- 1 c. Dr. Burgess explained that his failure to meet the CME requirements is due to his having
2 been diagnosed and treated for cancer in 2009 and 2010. He relocated to Seattle in July
3 2009 for surgery, radiation and chemotherapy. After returning to Alaska and to work in
4 April 2010, he has continued to undergo monthly treatment in Seattle. Under these
5 extenuating circumstances, Dr. Burgess has requested an extension of time to complete the
6 remaining 18.5 hours of CME.
- 7 f. In accordance with 12 AAC 40.200, Dr. Burgess has made the request for an extension of
8 time on his renewal application. He has explained his illness and extenuating circumstances,
9 and has provided documentation verifying his illness and treatment, as well as
10 documentation of his completion of 31.5 hours of CME completed between January 1, 2009
11 and December 31, 2010.
- 12 4. Effect of Non-Acceptance of Agreement. This Consent Agreement is subject to the approval of
13 the Board. Dr. Burgess and the Division agree that if the Board rejects this agreement, it will be
14 void, and Dr. Burgess' physician license application will be denied. If the Board rejects this
15 agreement, it will not constitute a waiver of Dr. Burgess's right to a hearing on the license denial
16 and any admissions contained herein will have no effect. Dr. Burgess agrees that, if the Board
17 rejects this agreement, the Board may decide the matter after a hearing, and its consideration of
18 this agreement alone shall not be grounds for claiming the Board is biased against him, that it
19 cannot fairly decide the case, or that it has received ex parte communication.
- 20 5. Consent Agreement, Decision and Order. Dr. Burgess agrees that the board has the authority to
21 enter into this Consent Agreement and to issue the following Decision and Order. Dr. Burgess
22 and the Division agree that the Board may adopt the Decision and Order in its entirety, or may
23 adopt a revised Decision and Order.

DECISION AND ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1) Dr. Burgess shall be granted an extension of time of 120 days in which to satisfy the CME
requirements of 12 AAC 40.200, in accordance with AS 12 AAC 200(b) and as further described
in Paragraph A below.
- 2) Dr. Burgess' physician's license shall be renewed for the 2011-2012 licensing period in
accordance with 12 AAC 40.200(b).
- A. Compliance with the Continuing Medical Education (CME) Requirements
- With this agreement, Dr. Burgess provides documentation of 31.5 Category I AMA approved
CME credit hours obtained by completing the activities approved by the Board or its designee as
indicated on the attached Continuing Education Review Form and documentation.
- Dr. Burgess agrees to submit documentation verifying his completion of at least 18.5 hours of
Category I AMA CME credit hours no later than 120 days from the date of adoption of this
agreement by the Board.
- Under the terms of this agreement, the board agrees to accept 18.5 hours of approved Category
I AMA CME credit hours completed no later than 120 days from the date of adoption of this

1 agreement by the Board, in order to meet the requirements of 12 AAC 40.200 for the renewal of
2 Dr. Burgess' 2011-2012 renewal.

3 The CME credit hours used to meet this requirement may not be used to satisfy the CME
4 requirement for any future renewal or reinstatement of this license.

5 **B. Violation of Agreement**

6 Dr. Burgess hereby agrees that if he fails to complete the 18.5 hours of Category I AMA CME
7 credit hours within 120 days of the date the Board adopts this agreement, his license shall be
8 suspended.

9 If his license is suspended under this section, he shall be entitled to an administrative hearing
10 regarding the issue of the suspension in accordance with AS 44.62. If Dr. Burgess's license is
11 suspended, he will continue to be responsible for all license requirements pursuant to AS 08.64.

12 In the event Dr. Burgess's physician license lapses for nonrenewal while in a suspended status, the
13 license will be considered "lapsed while under suspension" and to reinstate this license:

- 14 1) All terms of this agreement must be satisfied; and
- 15 2) All requirements pursuant to AS 08.64 and 12 AAC 40 to reinstate a lapsed
16 physician license must be met.

17 Dr. Burgess agrees that failure to comply with a request by the board or its agent to allow review
18 of his compliance with the conditions of this agreement shall be deemed a violation of the terms
19 of this agreement.

6 Data Bank (HIPDB) and any other entities as may be required by law.

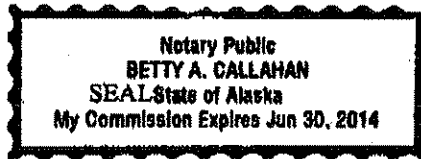
7 ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT
