## CEASE PRACTICE ORDER

In the Medical Board of California (Board) Case No. 800-2013-000597, the Board issued a Decision adopting a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, which became effective December 2, 2016. In the Board's Order, Physician's and Surgeon's License No. G 13099, issued to David Sosin, M.D., was revoked, revocation stayed and Respondent was placed on five (5) years' probation.

Probationary Condition No. 8, Monitoring – Practice, requires Respondent within 30 days of the effective date of the decision, to submit to the Board or its designee for prior approval as a practice monitor(s), the name and qualifications of one or more licensed physicians and surgeons whose licenses are valid and in good standing, and who are preferably American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) certified.

If the monitor resigns or is no longer available, Respondent shall, within 5 calendar days of such resignation or unavailability, submit to the Board or its designee, for prior approval, the name and qualifications of a replacement monitor who will be assuming that responsibility within 15 calendar days. If Respondent fails to obtain approval of a replacement monitor within 60 calendar days of the resignation or unavailability of the monitor, Respondent shall receive a notification from the Board or its designee to cease the practice of medicine within three (3) calendar days after being so notified Respondent shall cease the practice of medicine until a replacement monitor is approved and assumes monitoring responsibility.

The Respondent has failed to obey Probationary Condition No. 8 as ordered in the above Decision, by failing to obtain approval of a replacement monitor within 60 calendar days of the unavailability of his previous monitor. Accordingly, Respondent, David Sosin, M.D., is prohibited from engaging in the practice of medicine. The Respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until a replacement monitor has been approved.
