CEASE PRACTICE ORDER


In the Medical Board of California (Board) Case No. 800-2015-018519, the Board issued a Decision After Non-Adoption, which became effective April 2, 2021. In the Board's Order, Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 43306, issued to Brooke Millon Barton, M.D., was ordered revoked, revocation stayed, and Respondent was placed on probation for 5 years with terms and conditions.

Probationary Condition No. 1, Clinic Competence Assessment Program – Within 60 calendar days of the effective date, Respondent shall enroll in a clinical competence assessment program approved in advance by the Board or its designee. If Respondent fails to enroll, participate in, or successfully complete the clinical competence assessment program within the designated time period, the Board shall order Respondent to cease the practice of medicine.

Probationary Condition No. 6, Monitoring – Practice – Professional Enhancement Program – Within 30 calendar days of the effective date, Respondent shall enroll in a professional enhancement program approved in advance by the Board or its designee, that includes, at a minimum, quarterly chart review, semi-annual practice assessment, and semi-annual review of professional growth and education. Respondent shall participate in the professional enhancement program at Respondent's expense during the term of probation. If Respondent fails to enroll in a professional enhancement program approved by the Board or its designee within 60 calendar days of the effective date of the decision, or fails to maintain enrollment once enrolled, Respondent shall receive a notification from the Board or its designee to cease the practice of medicine within three calendar days of being so notified. Respondent shall cease the practice of medicine until Respondent is enrolled in a professional enhancement program approved by the board or its designee.

Respondent has failed to obey Probationary Condition Nos.1 and 6, as ordered in the above Decision, by failing to enroll in a clinical competence assessment program within 60 calendar days of the effective date of the decision and by failing to enroll in a professional enhancement program within 60 calendar days of the effective date of the decision. Accordingly, Respondent, Brooke Millon Barton, M.D., is prohibited from engaging in the practice of medicine. Respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until enrollment in the Clinic Competence Assessment Program and the Professional Enhancement Program has been completed.
