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**ORDER TERMINATING SUSPENSION AND IMPOSING PROBATION**

On June 22, 2021, Disciplinary Panel A (the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) issued a Final Decision and Order, wherein the Panel concluded, as a matter of law, that Sanjeev Singhal, M.D., was guilty of immoral and unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine. Pursuant to the terms of the Final Decision and Order, Panel A suspended Dr. Singhal’s Maryland medical license for a minimum of six (6) months, reprimanded him, required that he enroll in and comply with the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program (“MPRP”), and successfully complete a course on professionalism. The Order further stipulated that, after the minimum period of suspension, if Dr. Singhal has fully and satisfactorily complied with all terms and conditions for the suspension, and if MPRR finds and notifies the Panel that Dr. Singhal is safe to return to the practice of medicine, Dr. Singhal may submit a written petition to terminate the suspension. The Order provided that upon termination of the suspension, the disciplinary panel shall impose probation for a minimum period of two (2) years with continued enrollment in MPRP.

Dr. Singhal has complied with the terms and conditions of the June 22, 2021 Final Decision and Order and MPRP has endorsed his safe return to the practice of medicine, it is thus hereby

**ORDERED** that the suspension imposed under the June 22, 2021 Final Decision and Order is **TERMINATED**; and it is further

**ORDERED** that Dr. Singhal is placed on **PROBATION** for a minimum period of **TWO (2) YEARS**.<sup>1</sup> During the probationary period, Dr. Singhal shall comply with the following probationary terms and conditions:

1. Dr. Singhal shall remain enrolled in the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program as follows:
  - (a) shall fully and timely cooperate and comply with all MPRP's referrals, rules, requirements, including, but not limited to, the terms and conditions of the Participant Rehabilitation Agreement(s) and Participant Rehabilitation Plan(s) entered with MPRP, and shall fully participate and comply with all therapy, treatments, evaluations, and screenings as directed by MPRP;
  - (b) shall sign and update the written release/consent form requested by the Board and MPRP, including release/consent forms to authorize MPRP to make verbal and written disclosures to the Board and to authorize the Board to disclose relevant information to MPRP. Dr. Singhal shall not withdraw his release/consent;
  - (c) shall also sign any written release/consent forms to authorize MPRP to exchange with (i.e., disclose to and receive from) outside entities verbal and written information concerning Dr. Singhal and to endure that MPRP is authorized to receive the health care records of Dr. Singhal. Dr. Singhal shall not withdraw his release/consent; and
  - (d) Dr. Singhal's failure to comply with any of the above terms or conditions including the terms or conditions of the Participant Rehabilitation Agreement(s) or Participant Rehabilitation Plan(s) constitutes a violation of this Order; and it is further

**ORDERED** that, after Dr. Singhal has complied with all terms and conditions of probation and the minimum period of probation imposed by the Order has passed, Dr. Singhal may submit to the Board a written petition for termination of probation. After consideration of the petition, the probation may be terminated through an order of the disciplinary panel. Dr. Singhal may be required to appear before the disciplinary panel to discuss his petition for termination. The disciplinary panel

will grant the petition to terminate the probation, through and order of the disciplinary panel, if Dr. Singhal has complied with all probationary terms and conditions and there are no pending complaints with the Board related to Dr. Singhal's conduct in the practice of medicine; and it is further

**ORDERED** that, if Dr. Singhal allegedly fails to comply with any term or condition imposed by this Order, Dr. Singhal shall be given notice and an opportunity for a hearing. If a disciplinary panel determines there is a genuine dispute as to a material fact, the hearing shall be before an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings followed by an exceptions process before a disciplinary panel; and if a disciplinary panel determines there is no genuine dispute as to a material fact, Dr. Singhal shall be given a show cause hearing before a disciplinary panel; and it is further

**ORDERED** that, after the appropriate hearing, if the disciplinary panel determines that Dr. Singhal has failed to comply with any term or condition imposed by this Order, the disciplinary panel may reprimand Dr. Singhal, place Dr. Singhal on probation with appropriate terms and conditions, or suspend with appropriate terms and conditions, or revoke Dr. Singhal's license to practice medicine in Maryland. The disciplinary panel may, in addition to one or more of the sanctions set forth above, impose a civil monetary fine on Dr. Singhal, and it is further

**ORDERED** that there shall be no early termination of probation; and it is further

**ORDERED** that Dr. Singhal is responsible for all costs incurred in fulfilling the terms and conditions of this Order; and it is further;

**ORDERED** that, unless stated otherwise in the order, any time period prescribed in this order begins when this Order goes into effect. This Order goes into effect upon the signature of the Board's Executive Director, who signs on behalf of Panel A; and it is further;

**ORDERED** that this Order is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6).
