On 07-22-2017 at approximately 21:55 hours Officer Wagenmaker and I were dispatched to Rangoli Indian Cuisine at 3055 E Walton Blvd for intoxicated subjects attempting to get into a vehicle and drive. Dispatch advised us that the store manager was attempting to talk three male subjects who appeared to be intoxicated out of driving away in a motor vehicle.

**INVESTIGATION:**

Upon arrival, I entered into the business plaza from the west drive entrance. As I was driving through the parking lot in attempt to locate the caller, a black Chevrolet equinox drove past me going west bound towards the entrance I came in from. I then observed a male subject who stepped out near my patrol vehicle and advised me that the black Chevrolet equinox was the vehicle with the intoxicated subjects.

I drove out of the east entrance and headed back west bound on Walton Blvd towards the west entrance. At this time the Chevrolet equinox was sitting in the west entrance of the plaza with the vehicle running. The driver of the equinox then put the vehicle in reverse and struck a mailbox in the plaza parking lot. The driver then went back east bound through the lot, I then activated my patrol vehicle lights and initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle with MI plate DNE 7911.

Upon approaching the vehicle I made contact with Maninderpal [REDACTED] Dhillon (identified by MI operators license). I advised Mr. Dhillon to shut the vehicle off and step out of the vehicle. I then brought Mr. Dhillon to the front of my patrol vehicle and Mr. Dhillon consented to a search of his person. No contraband was located.

In speaking with Mr. Dhillon he exhibited blood shot eyes. I could smell a strong odor of intoxicants coming from Mr. Dhillons person. I then asked Mr. Dhillon how much alcohol he had to drink on todays date and he told me just a few beers at the Rangoli Indian Cuisine. I then asked Mr. Dhillon how long ago his last drink was and he said a few hours.

I then asked Mr. Dhillon to complete SFST's to which he complied.

**SFST's:**

Test #1: HGN: Lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes. Distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes. Onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes. It should be noted that Mr. Dhillon was reinstructed to keep his head still and follow the pen with his eyes only.

Test #2: One leg stand: Mr. Dhillon swayed while balancing. Mr. Dhillon had to be reinstructed of the test several times. Mr. Dhillon put his foot down on the pavement prior to me telling him the test was complete. Mr. Dhillon had to be reinstructed to look at his foot while counting out loud.

Test #3: Walk-and-turn: Mr. Dhillon could not keep his balance while listening to instructions. Mr. Dhillon started before instructions were finished. Mr. Dhillon did not touch heel-to-toe on all steps. Mr. Dhillon lost balance while walking (stepped off line). Mr. Dhillon was stopped the first time on step number 9 due to failure to complete the turn around. Mr. Dhillon was walking backwards and counting steps down from 9 to 8 to 7. I then stopped Mr. Dhillon and reinstructed the test and had him finish.

**Investigation Continued:**

Mr. Dhillon was then advised of his PBT rights to which he refused to take. Mr. Dhillon was then advised he was under arrest for OWI. He was handcuffed to the rear, double locked, and tension checked. Mr. Dhillon advised the cuffs were not too tight.

PBT was administered to both of the passengers to see if either were under the legal limit to operate the vehicle, however both subjects were above legal limit. The subjects identified as Inderbir S. Johal and Gursimran Singh advised that they were within walking distance from someone they knew who lived on Walton Blvd and that they would walk.

The Chevrolet equinox was then searched. No contraband was located. I then took photos of the rear of the vehicle showing the damage from hitting the mailbox. I also took photos of the mailbox showing the damage. A vehicle impound slip was then completed for the Chevrolet equinox. The vehicle was impounded by Jakes towing (BC #427).

Mr. Dhillon was then transported back to AHPD for fingerprinting and processing. He was read his chemical test rights off a DI-177 form. He agreed to take a breath test. During the 15 minute observation period Mr. Dhillon did not eat, drink, vomit, burp. The results of the test were .14 and



.14. The DI-177 breath form was then entered into LEIN from Front Desk Officer Baker. Mr. Dhillon was then processed and fingerprinted TCN#:B517203004P. I then transported Mr. Dhillon to OCJ where he was lodged and RPI'd at 04:20 hours. A cost recovery sheet was completed.

**Information:**

Officers Morgan and Wagenmaker requested assistance in the parking lot of Rangoli Indian Cuisine, 3055 E. Walton Blvd. as they had a traffic stop on a suspected intoxicated motorist.

**Investigation:**

I arrived at the scene of the traffic stop and Officer Morgan was having the driver involved in the traffic stop, Maninderpal Dhillon, complete field sobriety tasks. For further details on the subsequent arrest of Mr. Dhillon, see Officer Morgan's report.

I made contact with Anto Joseph, who provided his Michigan driver's license for identification. Mr. Joseph is employed at Rangoli Indian Cuisine as he is the manager of the restaurant. Mr. Joseph contacted OCSO Dispatch to advise of a possible intoxicated motorist that had left



## Rangoli Indian Cuisine.

Mr. Joseph told me that 3 males had come inside Rangoli Indian Cuisine, and as soon as they walked in, the three had asked if they could bring their own alcoholic beverages inside. Mr. Joseph said he informed the three customers that they could not bring their own alcohol to consume inside the restaurant. Mr. Joseph said the 3 males then left the restaurant only to return a short time later.

After returning to the restaurant, Mr. Joseph said the three sat down at a table and ordered food. Mr. Joseph said it appeared as the three males were heavily intoxicated and therefore no alcohol was served to the men, even though the three men requested alcohol with their order.

Mr. Joseph said that the three men were rather loud and disruptive while inside the restaurant and when they were preparing to leave, Mr. Joseph offered to call an Uber ride for the three men. Mr. Joseph said he offered the alternative ride because he felt that none of the men were in any condition to be driving a vehicle. Mr. Joseph said that the offer was refused and the men wanted to drive. Mr. Joseph said that after the alternative transportation was refused, he contacted OCSO Dispatch because he did not want the men driving due to their apparent intoxication level.

After calling OCSO Dispatch, Officer Morgan noticed the vehicle, described as a black Chevy Equinox, as it was attempting to leave the parking lot. Furthermore, Officer Morgan and Wagenmaker observed the Chevy Equinox strike a mailbox on the Western portion of the parking lot. After striking the mailbox, Officer Morgan stopped the Chevy Equinox and conducted an operating while intoxicated investigation on the driver, Mr. Dhillon.

There were no reported injuries and the Chevy Equinox involved sustained minor damage. Officer Morgan completed a UD-10 private property crash report.

### CHEMICAL TEST RIGHTS

I am requesting that you take a chemical test to check for alcohol and/or controlled substances or other intoxicating substances in your body. IF YOU WERE ASKED TO TAKE OR TOOK A PRELIMINARY BREATH TEST BEFORE YOUR ARREST, YOU MUST STILL TAKE THE TEST I AM OFFERING YOU.

If you refuse to take this chemical test, it will not be given without a court order, but I may seek to obtain such a court order. Your refusal to take this test shall result in the suspension of your operator's or chauffeur's license and vehicle group designation or operating privilege, and the addition of six points to your driving record.

After taking my chemical test, you have a right to demand that a person of your own choosing administer a breath, blood, or urine test. You will be given a reasonable opportunity for such a test. You are responsible for obtaining a chemical analysis of a test sample taken by a person of your own choosing.

The results of both chemical tests shall be admissible in a judicial proceeding, and will be considered with other admissible evidence in determining your innocence or guilt.

\*MCL 257.625c(2) provides that a person afflicted with hemophilia, diabetes, or a condition requiring the use of an anticoagulant shall not be considered to have given consent to the withdrawal of blood.
