ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION

An Administrative Complaint has been filed against the above-named Respondent as provided by the Public Health Code, 1978 PA 368, as amended; MCL 333.1101 et seq, the rules promulgated thereunder, and the Administrative Procedures Act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, as amended; MCL 24.201 et seq; and

Section 16233(5) of the Public Health Code, supra, mandates the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (Department) to find that the public health, safety and welfare requires emergency action if a licensee is convicted of a felony; a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for a maximum of two years; or a misdemeanor involving the illegal delivery, possession or use of a controlled substance; and

Based on Respondent's convictions as set forth in the Administrative Complaint, and pursuant to section 16233(5) of the Public Health Code, supra, the Department finds that the public health, safety or welfare requires emergency action; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's license to practice as a medical doctor in the state of Michigan is SUMMARILY SUSPENDED, commencing the date this Order is served.

Section 7311(6) of the Public Health Code, supra, provides that a controlled substance license is automatically void if a licensee's license to practice is suspended or revoked under Article 15 of the Public Health Code.

Under Mich Admin Code, R 792.10702, Respondent has the right to petition for the dissolution of this Order of Summary Suspension. This petition shall clearly state that it is a "Petition for Dissolution of a Summary Suspension" and shall be filed with the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Bureau of Health Care Services, P.O. Box 30670, Lansing, Michigan 48909.
