CONSENT ORDER

IT IS FOUND that Respondent violated the Public Health Code, as set forth in the Administrative Complaint; accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that Respondent is:

- 1. FINED \$2,500.00, to be paid to the State of Michigan within 60 days from the effective date of this Order. The fine shall be mailed to the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Bureau of Professional Licensing, Compliance Section, P.O. Box 30189, Lansing, MI 48909. The fine shall be paid by check or money order made payable to the state of Michigan, and the check or money order shall clearly display file number 51-18-151920; and
- 2. Placed on PROBATION for a minimum period of one day and not to exceed one year, commencing on the effective date of this Order. During the probationary period, Respondent shall provide proof of having completed the continuing education deficiency as indicated in the Administrative Complaint. These hours

shall not apply in computing Respondent's current continuing education requirements for license renewal.

Respondent shall be discharged from probation upon receipt by the Department of proof of completion of the continuing education deficiency as indicated in the Administrative Complaint PROVIDED Respondent has paid the fine as set forth above, has complied with the terms of this Order, and has not violated the Public Health Code.

Verification of continuing education shall be mailed to the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Bureau of Professional Licensing, Compliance Section, P.O. Box 30670, Lansing, MI 48909.

Failure to pay the fine or complete the deficient hours within the time allotted shall result in suspension of the license. The suspension shall be automatically lifted if the fine is paid in full and the deficient hours are completed within six months of the suspension. However, if the license remains suspended for more than six months due to failure to pay the fine or complete the deficient hours, the licensee must apply for reinstatement of the license in accordance with Sections 16245 and 16247 of the Code.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order shall be effective 30 days from the date signed by the Disciplinary Subcommittee's Chairperson or authorized representative, as set forth below.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

 - 2. Respondent is licensed as a(n) Osteopathic Physician in the state of Michigan.

Respondent shall submit the response to the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Bureau of Professional Licensing, CE Audit, P.O. Box 30670, Lansing, MI 48909.

Respondent's failure to submit an answer within 30 days is an admission of the allegation in this Complaint. If Respondent fails to answer, the Department shall transmit this Complaint directly to the Board's Disciplinary Subcommittee to impose a sanction, pursuant to MCL 333.16231(9).
