

**SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE MISSOURI
STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR THE HEALING ARTS
AND ROBIN R. REED, M.D.**

Come now Robin R. Reed, M.D., (hereinafter the "Licensee") and the State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts (hereinafter the "Board") and enter into this agreement for the purpose of resolving the question of whether Dr. Reed's license as a physician and surgeon will be subject to discipline. Licensee and the Board jointly stipulate and agree that a final disposition of this matter may be effectuated as described below pursuant to § 621.045, RSMo.

1. Licensee acknowledges that she understands the various rights and privileges afforded by law, including the right to a hearing of the charges against her; the right to appear and be represented by legal counsel; the right to have all charges against her proven upon the record by competent and substantial evidence; the right to cross-examine any witnesses appearing at the hearing against her; the right to present evidence on her own behalf; the right to a decision based upon the record by a fair and impartial administrative hearing commissioner concerning the charges pending against the Licensee; and subsequently, the right to a disciplinary hearing before the Board at which time evidence may be presented in mitigation of discipline. Having been advised of these rights provided to the Licensee by operation of law, the Licensee knowingly and voluntarily waives each and every one of these rights and freely enters into this agreement and agrees to abide by the terms of this document as they pertain to her.

2. The Licensee acknowledges that she may, at the time this agreement is effective or within fifteen days thereafter, submit this agreement to the Administrative

Hearing Commission for determination that the facts agreed to by the parties constitute grounds for discipline of the Licensee's license.

3. The Licensee acknowledges that she has been informed of her right to consult legal counsel in this matter.

4. The parties stipulate and agree that the disciplinary order agreed to by the Board and the Licensee in Part III herein is based only on the agreement set out in Parts I and II herein. The Licensee understands that the Board may take further disciplinary action against her based on facts or conduct not specifically mentioned in this document that are either now known to the Board or may be discovered.

5. The Licensee understands and agrees that the Missouri State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts will maintain this agreement as an open record of the Board as required by Chapters 334, 610, 620 and 621, RSMo, as amended.

I. JOINT STIPULATION OF FACTS

Based upon the foregoing, the Board and the Licensee herein jointly stipulate to the following:

6. The State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts is an agency of the State of Missouri created and established pursuant to §334.120, for the purpose of executing and enforcing the provisions of Chapter 334, RSMo.

7. The Licensee is licensed by the Board as a physician and surgeon, License Number 2005008907. This license was first issued on March 24, 2005. Licensee's license is current, and was current and active at all times relevant herein.

8. On or about the morning of October 10, 2006, the Licensee called the Lexington Police Department (LPD) and claimed to be infected with eggs.

9. Later that same day, the Licensee called LPD to inform them that she was in the shower bleeding.

10. Patrolman Chris Ray and Chief Rector of LPD went to the Licensee's residence to check the Licensee's well being.

11. When the Licensee answered the door, she was completely wet and naked.

12. When told to put on clothes, the Licensee responded that all her clothes were contaminated with worms, but eventually agreed to put on a coat.

13. Patrolman Ray and Chief Rector did not see any signs of blood or injuries on the Licensee and did not find any indication of blood in the shower.

14. The Licensee asked both Patrolman Ray and Chief Rector whether they could see the worms on her skin. Neither saw anything on her skin.

15. The Licensee asked to be treated by a hospital and was transported by EMS.

16. Patrolman Ray and Chief Rector continued to search the Licensee's house, which they saw was dirty, filled with pet feces and urine, and observed what was later determined to be marijuana at the residence.

17. Also observed in the Licensee's residence were two live chickens and one dead chicken in a cage. There was a fourth chicken running loose in the garage.

18. The Licensee's aforementioned conduct constitutes a cause for the Board to discipline the Licensee's license pursuant to §334.100.2(25), RSMo.

II. JOINT CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

19. Cause exists to discipline Licensee's license pursuant to Section 334.100.2(25), RSMo, which states:

2. The board may cause a complaint to be filed with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621, RSMo, against any holder of any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required by this chapter or any person who has failed to renew or has surrendered the person's certificate of registration or authority, permit or license for any one or any combination of the following causes:

. . . .

(25) Being unable to practice as a physician and surgeon or with a specialty with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reasons of medical or osteopathic incompetency, or because of illness, drunkenness, excessive use of drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or as a result of any mental or physical condition. The following shall apply to this subdivision:

. . . .

20. The Licensee's conduct, as established by the foregoing facts, falls within the intendments of § 334.100.2, RSMo.

21. Cause exists for the Board to take disciplinary action against the Licensee's license under § 334.100.2, RSMo.

III. JOINT AGREEMENT ON DISCIPLINE

Based on the foregoing, the parties mutually agree and stipulate that the following shall constitute the disciplinary order entered by the Board in this matter under the authority of §621.110 RSMo 2000. This agreement, including the disciplinary order, will

be effective immediately on the date entered and finalized by the Board. The following are the terms of the disciplinary order:

22. License number 2005008907, issued by the Board to the Licensee, is hereby VOLUNTARILY SURRENDERED. The Licensee understands that this agreement is a public document and will be reported to the National Practitioner's Data Bank, the Health Integrity and Protection Data Bank, and the Federation of State Medical Boards as an action in lieu of discipline.

23. Within ten (10) days of the effective date of this agreement, the licensee shall return all indicia of Missouri medical licensure to the board, including but not limited to, her wall-hanging license and pocket card.

24. For purposes of this agreement, unless otherwise specified in this agreement, all reports, documentation, evaluations, notices, or other materials required to be submitted to the Board in this agreement shall be forwarded to The State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts, Attention: Investigations, P.O. Box 4, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.

25. In the event The State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts determines that the Licensee has violated any term or condition of this agreement, the Board may elect to pursue any lawful remedies afforded it and is not bound by this agreement in its election of remedies concerning that violation. The Board may in its discretion, vacate this agreement and impose such further discipline as the Board shall deem appropriate pursuant to §620.153, RSMo.

26. This agreement does not bind the Board or restrict the remedies available to it concerning any other violation of Chapter 334, RSMo, by the Licensee not specifically mentioned in this document.

27. No additional order shall be entered by this Board pursuant to the preceding paragraph of this agreement without notice and an opportunity for hearing before this Board as a contested case in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 536, RSMo. If any alleged violation of this agreement occurred during the disciplinary period, the parties agree that the Board may choose to conduct a hearing before it either during the disciplinary period, or as soon thereafter as a hearing can be held, to determine whether a violation occurred and, if so, may impose further disciplinary action. The Licensee agrees and stipulates that the Board has continuing jurisdiction to hold a hearing to determine if a violation of this agreement has occurred.

28. The Licensee hereby waives and releases the Board, its members, and any of its employees, agents, or attorneys, including any former Board members, employees, agents, and attorneys, of, or from, any liability, claim, actions, causes of action, fees, costs and expenses, and compensation, including, but not limited to any claims for attorneys fees and expenses, including any claims pursuant to §536.087, RSMo, or any claim arising under 42 USC 1983, which may be based upon, arise out of, or relate to any of the matters raised in this agreement, or from the negotiation or execution of this agreement. The parties acknowledge that this paragraph is severable from the remaining portions of this agreement in that it survives in perpetuity even in the event that any court of law deems this agreement or any portion thereof void or unenforceable.

29. In consideration of the foregoing, the parties consent to the termination of any further proceedings based upon the facts set forth herein.
