This matter is before the North Carolina Medical Board (hereafter, "Board") on information regarding David Daniel Broadhead, M.D. (hereafter, "Dr. Broadhead"). Dr. Broadhead admits, and the Board finds and concludes, that:

Whereas, the Board is a body duly organized under the laws of North Carolina and is the proper party to bring this proceeding under the authority granted it in Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the North Carolina General Statutes and the rules and regulations promulgated thereto, and

Whereas, Dr. Broadhead is a physician licensed by the Board to practice medicine and surgery on or about June 19, 1969, license number 16325, and

Whereas, at the times relevant herein, Dr. Broadhead practiced medicine in Southern Shores, North Carolina, and

Whereas the Board received information that gave it concern about Dr. Broadhead's prescribing practices, particularly his prescribing of controlled substances, and

Whereas, the Board obtained several charts of Dr. Broadhead's patients and had those charts reviewed by an outside expert, and

Whereas, that review found that Dr. Broadhead's record keeping and documentation for his patients, as well as his utilization of benzodiazepines, were below acceptable and prevailing standards of practice in North Carolina, and

Whereas, the review of Dr. Broadhead's patient charts also found deficiencies with Dr. Broadhead's simultaneous use of two benzodiazepines in high doses for anxiety and that use of same in patients with a history of substance abuse, and

Whereas, Dr. Broadhead's conduct, as described above, constitutes unprofessional conduct, including, but not limited to, departure from, or the failure to conform to, the standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice, irrespective of whether or not a patient is injured thereby, within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6), and grounds exist under that section of the North Carolina General Statutes for the Board to annul, suspend, revoke, or limit Dr. Broadway's license to practice medicine issued by the Board or to deny any future application he Consent Order - David Daniel Broadhead, M.D.

- 5. If Dr. Broadhead fails to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, that failure shall constitute unprofessional conduct within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Whereas, the Board is a body duly organized under the laws of North Carolina and is the proper party to bring this proceeding under the authority granted it in Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the North Carolina General Statutes, and

Whereas, the Board issued Dr. Broadhead a license to practice medicine and surgery on June 19, 1969, license number 16325, and

Whereas, during the times relevant herein, Dr. Broadhead practiced medicine in Southern Shores, North Carolina, and

Whereas, in January 2008, Dr. Broadhead entered into a Consent Order with this Board based on findings that Dr. Broadhead had certain deficiencies in the manner in which he practiced medicine, and

Whereas, as part of the Board's ongoing review of Dr. Broadhead, the Board ordered Dr. Broadhead for a professional assessment by the Center for Personalized Education for Physicians ("CPEP"), and

Whereas, Dr. Broadhead complied with that Board Order and completed an assessment with CPEP, and

Whereas, the result of that assessment was that Dr. Broadhead had certain clinical deficiencies and that Dr. Broadhead needed to formulate a remediation plan to address these deficiencies, and

Whereas, as part of the Board's assessment, the Board learned that Dr. Broadhead had a medical condition that could affect his ability to practice medicine with a reasonable degree of skill and safety, and

Whereas, as evidenced by the above conduct, the Board has a basis to order Dr. Broadhead to undertake a remediation plan within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(5), and grounds exist under that section of the North Carolina General Statutes for the Board to annul, suspend, revoke, or limit Dr. Broadhead's license to practice medicine issued by the Board or to deny any application he might make in the future, and

Whereas, Dr. Broadhead would like to resolve this matter without the need for more formal proceedings, and

Whereas, the Board has determined that it is in the public interest to resolve this case as set forth below.

Now, therefore, with Dr. Broadhead's consent, it is ORDERED that:

- 1. Within THIRTY (30) DAYS of the execution of this Consent Order, Dr. Broadhead shall develop a remediation plan consistent with the recommendations contained in Dr. Broadhead's CPEP report and have this plan approved by the Board's Medical Director. Failure to develop an approved remediation plan within the prescribed period of time shall be deemed a violation of this Consent Order and grounds for the Board to discipline Dr. Broadhead's license to practice medicine. Furthermore, Dr. Broadhead shall comply with all aspects of his approved remediation plan and failure to comply shall be deemed a violation of this Consent Order and grounds for the Board to discipline Dr. Broadhead's license.
- 2. Within THIRTY (30) DAYS of the execution of this Consent Order, Dr. Broadhead shall enter into and maintain a contract with the North Carolina Physicians Health Program ("NCPHP") and abide by its terms, including the timely payment of any fees required by NCPHP. Failure to enter into a contract with NC PHP within the prescribed period and any violation of the terms and conditions of his NCPHP contract shall be deemed a

violation of this Consent Order and grounds for the Board to discipline Dr. Broadhead's license to practice medicine.

- 3. Dr. Broadhead shall obey all laws. Likewise, he shall obey all rules and regulations involving the practice of medicine.
- 4. Dr. Broadhead shall notify the Board in writing of any change in his residence or practice addresses within ten (10) days of the change.
- 5. Dr. Broadhead shall meet with the Board or members of the Board for an informal interview at such times as requested by the Board.
- 6. If Dr. Broadhead fails to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, that failure shall constitute unprofessional conduct within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6) and shall be grounds, after any required notice and hearing, for the Board to annul, suspend, or revoke his license to practice medicine and surgery and to deny any application he might make in the future or then have pending for a license.
- 7. This Consent Order shall take effect immediately upon its execution by both Dr. Broadhead and the Board and it shall continue in effect until specifically ordered otherwise by the Board.
- 8. Dr. Broadhead hereby waives any requirement under law or rule that this Consent Order be served on him.
