DANIEL CHANSKY, M.D., being duly sworn, deposes and says:

On or about March 12, 1945, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 042975 by the New York State Education Department.

My current address is 64-14 211 th Street, Bayside, New York, and I will advise the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct of any change of my address.

I understand that I have been charged with one specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for permission to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York on the grounds that I shall not contest the allegation contained in the Statement of Charges.

I hereby make this application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State

I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct grants my application, an order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me. I agree that such order shall be effective upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Surrender Order to me at the address set forth in this agreement, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is earliest.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner. In consideration of the value to me of the acceptance by the Board of this Application, allowing me to resolve this matter without the various risks and burdens of a hearing on the merits, I knowingly waive any right I may have to contest the Surrender Order for which I hereby apply, whether administratively or judicially, and ask that the Application be granted.



**STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES**

DANIEL CHANSKY, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about March 12, 1945, by the issuance of license number 0429~~57~~³⁵ by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. From in or about March 1971 through in or about 1991, Respondent, a psychiatrist, treated Patient A, (Patient A's identity is contained in the attached appendix) either at his office in Forest Hills, N.Y., or his home in Bayside, N.Y. During the course of therapy Respondent had inappropriate sexual conversations and contact with Patient A.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

FIRST SPECIFICATION

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(44)(a)(McKinney Supp. 1998) when in the course of practicing psychiatry, he had physical contact of a sexual nature with a patient, as alleged in the facts of:
