8	The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing,
9	regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the State of
10	Oregon. John Patrick Schrimsher, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the State of Oregon.
11	2.
12	The Board proposes to take disciplinary action by imposing up to the maximum range of
13	potential sanctions identified in ORS 677.205(2), which may include the revocation of license, a
14	\$10,000 civil penalty, and assessment of costs, against Licensee for violations of the Medical
15	Practice Act, to wit: ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in
16	ORS 677.188(4)(a) any conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the
17	medical profession or any conduct or practice which does or might constitute a danger to the
18	health or safety of a patient or the public or any conduct, practice or condition which does or
19	might adversely affect a physician's ability to safely and skillfully practice medicine; and ORS
20	677.190(17) willful violation of any rule adopted by the Board, specifically OAR 847-065-0055
21	Licensee Responsibilities.
22	3.
23	3.1 The American Medical Association has published a Code of Medical Ethics.
24	Opinion 9.3.1 of this Code of Ethics reads in part, "Physicians should not practice if their ability
25	to do so safely is impaired by use of a controlled substance, alcohol, other chemical agent or a
26	health condition."
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3.2 Licensee is a psychiatrist and practiced medicine in Astoria, Oregon. Licensee's acts and conduct alleged to violate the Medical Practice Act follow:

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3.2.1 Licensee was reported to have consumed alcohol during the hours when he was on duty as a physician at a behavioral health clinic. Consuming alcohol while on duty in a health care setting violates ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a) any conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession, or any conduct which does or might constitute a danger to the health or safety of a patient or the public, or any conduct, practice or condition which does or might adversely affect a physician's ability safely and skillfully to practice medicine.

3.2.2 On February 26, 2019, Licensee signed a monitoring agreement with the Health Professionals' Service Program (HPSP) in which he agreed to remain in compliance with all the conditions of the agreement, to include abstaining from the use of alcohol, calling an interactive voice response (IVR) number Monday through Saturday, and to submitting to random toxicology testing as requested during the IVR call. Licensee's enrollment in HPSP became effective on February 28, 2019. Licensee has failed to comply with the terms of the HPSP Monitoring Agreement. Contrary to the terms of the agreement, Licensee tested positive for alcohol on March 7, 2019, March 18, 2019, March 22, 2019, and August 2, 2019. Licensee failed to call the IVR number on March 6, 2019, and from May 22, 2019 through July 1, 2019, which resulted in Licensee missing numerous scheduled toxicology tests. On May 30, 2019, Licensee submitted a urine specimen that was determined to be dilute. On the same date, a blood specimen was obtained from Licensee that was determined to be positive for phosphatidyl ethanol. Between March 15, 2019, and September 12, 2019, the Board received over 20 noncompliance reports from HPSP detailing Licensee's failure to call daily for testing, failure to contact his Agreement Monitor weekly, and refusal to enter inpatient treatment when asked to do so. Each of these events represent an instance of substantial non1 compliance with the terms of the HPSP Monitoring Agreement, and constitute violations 2 of ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a) any conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the 4 medical profession, or any conduct which does or might constitute a danger to the health or safety of a patient or the public, or any conduct, practice or condition which does or might adversely affect a physician's ability to safely and skillfully to practice medicine; and ORS 677.190(17) willful violation of any rule adopted by the Board, specifically OAR 847-065-0055.

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Licensee is entitled to a hearing as provided by the Administrative Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised Statutes. Licensee may be represented by counsel at the hearing. If Licensee desires a hearing, the Board must receive Licensee's written request for hearing within twenty-one (21) days of the mailing of this Notice to Licensee. Upon receipt of a request for a hearing, the Board will notify Licensee of the time and place of the hearing.

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- 5.1 If Licensee requests a hearing, Licensee will be given information on the procedures, right of representation, and other rights of parties relating to the conduct of the hearing as required under ORS 183.413(2) before commencement of the hearing.
- 5.2 In the event of a hearing, the Board proposes to assess against Licensee the Board's costs of this disciplinary process and action, including but not limited to all legal costs from the Oregon Department of Justice, all hearing costs from the Office of Administrative Hearings, all costs associated with any expert or witness, all costs related to security and transcriptionist services for the hearing and administrative costs specific to this proceeding in an amount not to exceed \$50,000, pursuant to ORS 677.205(2)(f).

6	Failure by Licensee to timely request a hearing or failure to appear at any hearing
7	scheduled by the Board will constitute waiver of the right to a contested case hearing and will
8	result in a default order by the Board, including the revocation of his medical license and
9	assessment of such penalty and costs as the Board deems appropriate under ORS 677,205. If a
10	default order is issued, the record of proceeding to date, including Licensee's file with the Board
11	and any information on the subject of the contested case automatically becomes a part of the
12	contested case record for the purpose of proving a prima facie case per ORS 183.417(4).
